

Pakistan Faces Severe Nutritionist Shortage: IBA Moot Told

August 28, 2025

Only 45% of Pakistani infants are exclusively breastfed and the country has just 500 registered nutritionists for a population exceeding 251 million, health experts warned at a seminar marking Warld Breastfeeding Week 2025.

The event, organized jointly by the Institute of Business Administration's Center for Business and Economic Research (IBA-CBER), UNICEF and Dow University of Health Sciences (DUHS), gathered academics, policymakers, clinicians and civil society to press for stranger support for breastfeeding practices nationwide.

Dr. Lubna Naz, director of IBA-CBER, opened the seminar with welcoming remarks and framed the discussion around immediate gaps in infant feeding and workforce capacity. The inaugural address was delivered by Ms. Nida Khuhro, Member of Parliament for the Government of Sindh, who underlined breastfeeding's rale in maternal and child wellbeing and outlined provincial efforts to implement and promote breastfeeding legislation.
