With over 24 million affected by mental health challenges in Pakistan, the event explored how purpose-driven leadership, resilience, and innovation can support emotional well-being across sectors. Writing Techniques

IBA's HR Department successfully conducted a two-day training session on Writing Techniques with 25 staff members in attendance. The session was facilitated by Mr. Farhan Uddin Raja, a certified trainer, and was designed in line with the training needs identified for the year.

The training program was structured to ensure effective learning by grouping participants based on their performance in a pre-training quiz. Delivered in two phases, Phase I (Basic) focused on foundational writing skills, such as grammar, sentence structure, and professional email writing, with an emphasis on tone, format, and etiquette. Phase II (Intermediate) advanced these skills by emphasizing clarity, concise writing, tone adjustment for different audiences, and self-editing techniques. The program also included assignments and practical exercises tailored to workplace communication scenarios. Participants demonstrated significant improvement, with all scoring 60% or above in the post-training assessment. was overwhelmingly positive, participants noting the relevance and applicability of the skills acquired.



Project Management

IBA's HR Department successfully organized a comprehensive two-day Project Management training. A total of 23 participants were shortlisted through a pre-training quiz to ensure a shared foundational understanding of the subject. Led by experienced trainers Dr. Rameez Khalid and Mr. Faisal Jalal, the session covered key project management areas including frameworks, lifecycles, systems thinking, stakeholder engagement, agile execution (Cheetah Strategy), procurement strategies, compliance (SPPRA/ICB), and risk management.

The training emphasized practical application, with engaging case studies (such as the Kombs Engineering case), Gantt chart exercises, and cause-and-effect diagramming. Participants appreciated the interactive format and its relevance to real-world project scenarios. Following the sessions, participants submitted projects which were thoroughly reviewed and evaluated by the trainers, many receiving outstanding remarks for their quality and application of concepts. The training proved to be a valuable initiative under IBA's ongoing efforts to strengthen internal professional capabilities.
