IBA Karachi Awards 1,353 Degrees at Convocation 2024





IBA Karachi held its Convocation for the Class of 2024 at the Main Campus. It marked a momentous occasion as 1,353 graduates were conferred degrees in several disciplines. The graduating batch included 990 graduates from 6 undergraduate programs, 362 graduates from 11 postgraduate programs, and 1 PhD graduate.

The Chief Guest of the ceremony was the Honorable Chief Minister of Sindh and Patron IBA, Syed Murad Ali Shah. Ms. Sultana Siddiqui, President of Hum Network & Founder of Moomal Productions attended as a Guest of Honor.

Patron IBA, Mr. Shah, praised IBA for building a legacy of leadership, excellence, and impact, supported by world-class faculty, 70% of whom hold PhD degrees from leading global institutions and serve as an inspiration to all. He stated, "This Convocation holds special significance as IBA prepares to celebrate its 70th Anniversary next year — a Legacy of Leadership, Excellence & Impact".

Dr. S Akbar Zaidi, Executive Director, IBA, applauded the graduating students on achieving this remarkable milestone which is a testament to their dedication and perseverance. Dr. Zaidi stated, "Today is particularly special as we celebrate the largest graduating class in IBA's history". He added, "This day also marks the beginning of a momentous year as we look forward to celebrating IBA's 70th Anniversary—a testament to our legacy of excellence and transformation."

Ms. Siddiqui applauded the graduates and recognized IBA for its academic excellence & societal impact and the remarkable achievements of its graduates who continue to make their alma mater proud. She stated, "IBA graduates should believe in their abilities, dream big, and hold firmly to the values of integrity and honesty as true success goes beyond personal achievements."

IBA Karachi and Stanford Life Design Lab Join Hands with the Sindh Government to Reimagine Karachi's Future

In a groundbreaking initiative, IBA leadership and faculty from Stanford University's Life Design Lab met with the Sindh government, led by Chief Minister Syed Murad Ali Shah, for a high-stakes strategy meeting. This collaboration, which began in California earlier this year, has now gained extraordinary momentum with the Stanford team stationed in Karachi to tackle the city's most pressing challenges from within.

The recent strategy meeting brought together key members of the Sindh cabinet, senior bureaucrats, and Stanford experts, focusing on how design thinking can address the critical issues faced by Karachi's 20+ million residents. From easing the traffic crisis to improving public safety and creating accessible open spaces for families, the discussions revolved around delivering swift, meaningful, and sustainable solutions.



The partnership's broader vision goes beyond Karachi's immediate challenges. Over the next three years, IBA team led by Dr. S Akbar Zaidi, Executive Director, IBA; Professor Azam Ali, Assistant Professor, IBA-SBS & Faculty Lead- Stanford & IBA Collaboration; Bill Burnett, Executive Director, Stanford Life Design Lab and Junaid Aziz, an IBA alumnus, Fellow and Faculty Member at Stanford's Life Design Lab, will work closely with the Sindh government to establish a new culture of problemsolving, training ministers, bureaucrats, and students to think differently and act decisively. The Chief Minister has tasked these committees with ensuring that no challenge—be it urban planning, environmental sustainability, or public welfare—is met with outdated approaches.

Under Junaid's guidance, Stanford's team and IBA's brightest students will begin working with ministers and provincial action committees formed specifically for this initiative. These teams aim to embed human-centered design practices within government processes, accelerating how solutions can be identified and implemented. Early prototypes include innovative ideas for traffic flow optimization, enhanced public spaces, and community-driven security measures designed to provide immediate relief and long-term benefits to Karachi's hardworking families.



Fourth Annual International Conference on "Rethinking Economics"

IBA proudly hosted the 4th Annual International Conference on "Rethinking Economics", which was organized in collaboration with IBA-SESS and IBA-CBER.

In his opening remarks, Dr. S Akbar Zaidi, Executive Director, IBA Karachi, emphasized the need for interdisciplinary and innovative approaches to economic challenges, inspiring academics and policymaking, and for students to envision sustainable and inclusive solutions for the future. Kiyoshi Taniguchi, Regional Lead Economist and Marcel Schröder, Country Economist, Asian Development Bank (ADB), shared insights from the Asian Development Outlook, forecasting 5% growth for developing Asia in 2024. The priorities for Strategy 2030, focusing on climate action, private sector growth, and digital transformation, were highlighted as the country's pressing challenges.







Dr. Lubna Naz, Director, IBA-CBER, delivered the welcome address. She presented the conference's vision and emphasized the significance of expanding on traditional economic thinking. She highlighted that IBA-CBER received a huge response to the call for papers and received 300 research papers while only 40 were selected after a rigorous review. This year, 25% of the panellists and presenters comprised women, reflecting on IBA's commitment to promoting gender equality in economic research and thinking. Participants from 11 countries participated in the conference, and 50 presenters and panellists from within the country, including highly marginalized areas of Pakistan.

The panel discussion "Rethinking International Trade in a Digitalized World" emphasized digitalization in trade, export competitiveness, reduced costs, and seamless operations. Key challenges included weak digital infrastructure, limited cross-border interoperability, and governance gaps. Economic experts in the parallel sessions emphasized innovation and reforms for Pakistan's sustainable growth, spotlighting initiatives like Pakistan Single Window to modernize trade. Dr. Zaidi and Dr. Ali Cheema, Vice Chancellor, LUMS, discussed higher education challenges in Pakistan, highlighting issues like funding, talent retention, and quality control. They emphasized the role of economists as university leaders, institutional reforms, and nurturing critical thinking and innovation. The session explored globalization's impact and fostering community engagement.

Day 2 featured a panel discussion, "Institutions, Laws, and Development". The panellists included Adeel Malik, Associate Professor, Oxford Department of International Development; Asad Khan, Partner, Ashtar Ali LLP; Sultan Mehmood, Professor, New Economic School, and Laila Farooq, Assistant Professor, IBA-SESS. The experts discussed the perspectives of the laws and institutional development in Pakistan and other countries and the role of laws in building societies. Technical sessions on inflation, growth, digitalization, innovation, and a roundtable on global academic partnerships with foreign faculty and the HEC Sindh Chairman were held.

Winter Immersion Program 2024: Redefining Entrepreneurship in Academia

IBA proudly conducted the 'Winter Immersion Program (WIP) 2024' at the City Campus, which was organized in collaboration with the IBA-CED. The program brought together renowned international trainers to shed light on the importance of entrepreneurship education, research, and incubation management in academia.

Dr. S Akbar Zaidi, Executive Director, IBA Karachi, delivered the keynote address. He highlighted that there needs to be an overhaul of the curriculum taught to students to consider the ever-evolving realm of entrepreneurship.

Dr. Sanna Ilonen, University Teacher and Mr. Joachim Ramstrom, Education Expert on Entrepreneurship & Innovation Education, School of Economics, University of Turku, and Mr. Islam Mohamed, Chief Investment Officer, Arweqah Al Reyadah, Saudi Arabia, were the trainers for the two workshops held over four days.

The first workshop, "Fostering Entrepreneurship in Academia", was led by Dr. Ilonen and Mr. Ramstrom, who have over two decades of combined experience in Entrepreneurship. They allowed participants to develop a robust understanding of the tools and resources needed to create and deliver engaging entrepreneurship modules or courses. The participants included university faculty, incubation centre staff and media professionals in attendance.

The second workshop, led by Mr. Mohamed, one of the brightest minds in the innovation ecosystem, on "Elevating Innovators and Incubators", underscored the necessary handson knowledge and skills to design and manage a thriving university-based business incubator program.

Dr. Lalarukh Ejaz, Director, IBA-CED, gave the closing remarks. She highlighted that there was a dire need for universities and incubators to engage in such activities and workshops where knowledge exchange and structured discourse took place.

A combination of lectures, interactive discussions, and case studies ensured that the WIP 2024 was a truly immersive learning experience for participants. The event exemplified IBA's dedication to fostering innovation and entrepreneurship through impactful collaboration and knowledge exchange.

IBA-CEE's research project, led by Dr. Hilal Anwar Butt, Chairperson, Finance Department, IBA-SBS, commissioned by SECP, aims to modernize corporate restructuring practices in Pakistan.

At the IFC, the team collaborated on Climate Governance and Leadership programs to equip Leaders with ESG skills for tackling climate challenges and fostering sustainable practices in line with Global Standards.

Through these initiatives, IBA continues to lead impactful efforts to drive economic reform, corporate sustainability, and leadership development in Pakistan.

World Islamic Finance Forum (WIFF) 2024: Bringing Together Global Leaders & Experts to Explore the Future of Islamic Finance





IBA Karachi hosted a two-day conference, World Islamic Finance Forum (WIFF) 2024, with the theme 'Islamic Finance: Innovation, Climate Finance & Sustainable Growth' organized by the IBA-CEIF. The forum was inaugurated at Movenpick Hotel, Karachi, to discuss policy guidelines and academic footprints in Islamic Finance. The conference brought together Regulatory Authorities, Researchers, Policymakers, renowned Academicians, leading Islamic bankers, Shariah Scholars, and prominent personalities from local and global Islamic financial Institutions.

The highlight of the conference was the addresses by the Chief Guest, Prof. Ahsan Iqbal, Federal Minister for Planning, Development & Special Initiatives; Dr. S Akbar Zaidi, Executive Director, IBA Karachi; Dr. Ishrat Husain, Professor Emeritus & Chairman, IBA-CEIF; Mr. Akif Saeed, Chairman, SECP; Mr. Saleem Ullah, Deputy Governor, SBP, and Mr. Ahmed Ali Siddiqui, Director, IBA-CEIF.

Dr. Zaidi, in his welcome note, highlighted the significant challenges ahead as Pakistan embarks on a transformative journey to align its economic system with the Islamic principles under the constitutional mandate. The Chief Guest, Prof. Ahsan Iqbal, underscored the critical role of quality education in shaping future leaders who can guide the country and world toward progress and prosperity. Addressing a diverse audience, the Federal Minister highlighted the importance of education in imparting knowledge and fostering Innovation, critical thinking, and a sense of ethical responsibility.

Dr. Husain highlighted the stark disparities in poverty levels between urban centres and smaller towns in Pakistan. He explained that targeted innovations in education, infrastructure, and technology can uplift marginalized communities, fostering economic inclusion and resilience.

Powering the Future with Green





IBA is leading the charge toward a sustainable future with its ambitious green initiatives. As part of its ongoing commitment to environmental stewardship, IBA has introduced several groundbreaking projects to reduce its carbon footprint and promote renewable energy across its campuses and hostels.

One of the key highlights is the launch of electric-powered shuttles at the IBA Main Campus. These eco-friendly vehicles, powered by the solar plant at the campus, offer a green transportation solution for the campus community. This initiative aligns with IBA's sustainability goals and represents a significant step towards minimizing dependency on fossil fuels, ensuring a cleaner and healthier environment.

Additionally, IBA has installed a total solar capacity of 926 kWp across its campuses. The solar infrastructure includes an 826 kWp system at the Main Campus and newly commissioned projects of 200 kWp at the Boys Hostel and 100 kWp at the Girls Hostel. Together, these installations generate an impressive 1.235 million kWh of clean energy annually, resulting in a 33% reduction in energy costs and significant cuts in carbon emissions. The savings from these projects are further being reinvested into student scholarships, demonstrating IBA's dedication to sustainability and community impact.

25th Annual Population Research Conference Focusing on Pathways to Sustainable Development

IBA Karachi proudly hosted the 25th Annual Population Research Conference, focusing on the Pathways to Sustainable Development, which was organized in collaboration with the Population Association of Pakistan (PAP) and the Population Research Centre (PRC) at IBA-SESS. The partnership with PAP highlights IBA's dedication to fostering collaboration among scholars, policymakers, and practitioners to address Pakistan's evolving demographic challenges.

Dr. S Akbar Zaidi, Executive Director, IBA Karachi, delivered the welcome remarks at the engaging inaugural session. Senator (R) Javed Jabbar, Director, Social Policy and Development Centre, Karachi, delivered the keynote address. Dr. Nasra Shah, President Executive Council, PAP, highlighted PAP's 25-year journey, reflecting on its contributions to population research.

The first panel, "Pakistan @ 2050," moderated by Dr. Asma Hyder, Dean, IBA-SESS, focused on the country's future challenges, including poverty, urbanization, and climate change. Experts like Dr. Zeba Sathar, Senior Associate and Pakistan Country Director, Population Council; Dr. Heman Das Lohano, Professor of Economics, IBA, Karachi, and Dr. G.M. Arif, Former Joint Director, Pakistan Institute of Development Economics and President Executive Council, PAP, delved into Pakistan's demographic trajectory, examining how rapid urbanization—projected to see over half of the population living in cities by 2050—will impact the nation's social and economic landscape. With 40% of urban residents currently living in slums, the discussion emphasized the urgent need for policies to address the opportunities and risks posed by urban growth and climate change, particularly in relation to migration and demographic shifts.

The spotlight session, "Data for Development" brought together the heads of regional PRCs, including Dr. Khadija Malik Bari, Director, IBA-PRC to discuss their ongoing initiatives, challenges, and opportunities in utilizing data for sustainable development. Dr. Bari highlighted key programs led by IBA-PRC, such as the Young Researchers Workshop Series, which engages emerging scholars to share research tools and methodologies with students, encouraging engagement and collaboration. Additionally, the IBA-PRC hosts a webinar series featuring international scholars, facilitating a global exchange of ideas on how data can be harnessed to address pressing development challenges.

The second day of the conference featured technical sessions and poster presentations on Migration, Brain Drain, Gender, Health Systems, And Data-Driven Decision-Making. The conference's final panel, "Private Sector Contribution in Family Planning", examined the role of the private sector in family planning and the utilization of data to measure impact.


Honouring a Legend: Khaled Ahmed's Life and Legacy
