SBS Hosts 4th International Conference 2025 on 'Transforming Business for People & Planet'







IBA-SBS held the 4th International Conference 2025 under the theme 'Transforming Business for People & Planet.' The two-day conference brought together global academics, corporate leaders, researchers, and students to address climate change, economic uncertainty, and sustainable business innovation.

In his opening remarks, Dr. S Akbar Zaidi, Executive Director, IBA, stressed the need for practical, collaborative solutions to global crises and called for greater corporate responsibility. Dr. Abdullah Zafar Sheikh, Dean IBA-SBS and Conference Chair, emphasized inclusive growth, fair wages, and employee well-being, citing IBA's global impact with over 250 alumni CEOs. Dr. Aitzaz Ahsan Alias Sarang, Assistant Professor IBA-SBS and Conference Convener, highlighted the climate vulnerability of developing nations and the need for green taxonomies to guide sustainable investment. The conference received 209 research paper submissions from 55+ universities, with 80% selected for presentation.

Keynote addresses were delivered by Dr. Victoria Hurth, Independent Pracademic and Fellow at CISL, who spoke on purpose-driven governance; Marie-Claire Cordonier Segger, Chair in Sustainable Development Law and Policy, University of Cambridge; and Dr. Yasin Rofcanin, Professor and Co-Director of the Future of Work Research Centre, University of Bath, both offering transformative insights on sustainability policy, innovation, and the evolving nature of work.

The conference featured panels on climate finance, sustainability governance, and technical sessions across disciplines. It reaffirmed IBA Karachi's role as a vital platform for shaping responsible business practices through global collaboration and knowledge exchange.

DR. ASMA HYDER

Professor and Dean, School of Economics and Social Sciences (SESS)

What inspired you to pursue an economics and social sciences career?

My interest in economics and social sciences grew from a curiosity about labor markets, gender, and structural inequalities. I was drawn to why some economies grow faster than others and why individuals raised in similar conditions can have vastly different outcomes. Economics gave me the tools to analyze resource allocation and policy impact, while social sciences offered the historical and cultural context to understand those outcomes. I was especially inspired by how research can inform public policy and improve lives in developing countries like Pakistan. This interdisciplinary approach has shaped my career as a researcher and academic leader, and I am committed to fostering the same perspective in students.

What role does SESS play within the larger IBA ecosystem?

IBA-SESS plays a vital role at IBA by offering a broad range of electives—Philosophy, Literature, Visual Arts, Mathematics, Religion, Environmental Sciences, Economics, and Foreign Languages—to students from all programs. These courses build essential reading, writing, critical thinking, quantitative analysis, and research skills. SESS also hosts faculty—and student—led forums on pressing issues like the budget, elections, the Indus Water Treaty, and discussions on literature, history, and politics. These forums are open to all and are especially enriching for business and computer science students.

How does SESS ensure its programs stay relevant in a rapidly changing world?

IBA-SESS keeps its programs relevant through academic innovation, interdisciplinary approaches, and responsiveness to real-world challenges. The curriculum is regularly updated to reflect global trends, such as technological shifts and social issues. For example, data science courses were introduced early on, climate change is addressed through region-specific courses, and urban planning is emphasized, given Karachi's context. This ensures students have foundational knowledge and the tools to tackle contemporary issues.

How does SESS support student research and experiential learning opportunities?

IBA-SESS fosters a strong research culture through student-faculty collaboration, supported by two research centers and four labs. Students actively lead research initiatives and often present their work at local and international conferences, gaining valuable experiential learning opportunities.

What is your vision for making SESS a hub for impactful social sciences research and policy dialogue in Pakistan?

IBA-SESS is home to some of Pakistan's top scholars, whose expertise extends beyond the classroom. As an independent academic institution, SESS contributes to national dialogue by offering expert input on key social and economic issues. Provincial and federal bodies regularly seek our feedback on policy matters. Evolving into a strong think tank, the SESS faculty also participates in international panels, and we are increasingly involving our graduate students in this work. I envision SESS becoming a leading hub for impactful research and policy dialogue in Pakistan.

Are there any international accreditations, partnerships, or exchange programs SESS is pursuing?

Recognizing the importance of global collaboration, IBA-SESS has established several national and international partnerships and exchange programs. The School is also engaged in joint policy work with the government on key initiatives.

What principles steer SESS in promoting diversity and a supportive space for everyone?

IBA-SESS actively promotes diversity across gender, ethnicity, and religion, standing out as one of the most diverse schools at IBA and among institutions in Pakistan.

What achievement at SESS are you most proud of?

I am proud of IBA-SESS's commitment to interdisciplinary learning, academic freedom, and critical inquiry, which has nurtured a new generation of scholars and professionals excelling in academia, policymaking, and international institutions. These achievements reflect the collective effort of our faculty, students, and staff, as well as our belief in rigorous and socially grounded education.


What advice would you give to students pursuing a career in economics or social sciences today?



Mental Health Hackathon 2025

IBA-CED, in collaboration with Synapse – Pakistan Neuroscience Institute, hosted Pakistan's first and largest in-person interdisciplinary Mental Health Hackathon.

The event brought together nearly 70 participants across 15 teams—including mental health professionals, entrepreneurs, technologists, and thought leaders—to design practical solutions for Pakistan's growing mental health challenges.

Structured around three core themes: Mass Mental Health Literacy, Early Intervention and Prevention, and Accessibility and Affordability of Care, the hackathon encouraged collaborative innovation.

Winning teams won cash prizes of PKR 100,000, PKR 75,000, and PKR 50,000, along with incubation opportunities at IBA-CED worth almost PKR 4 million.

Dr. Lalarukh Ejaz, Director, IBA-CED, emphasized the emotional strain within Pakistan's startup ecosystem and the need for collective action beyond mental health professionals for a meaningful change.

Dr. Ayesha Mian, Founder and CEO, Synapse, stressed the urgency of the crisis and highlighted the theme 'Doosri Nazar Se' to inspire creative thinking among youth to develop robust mental health solutions.

In the closing remarks, Dr. S Akbar Zaidi, Executive Director, IBA, said, "The work IBA Karachi has done over the past year in the mental health realm is just a precursor, and we endeavour to create further impact through the many opportunities we provide to the community."







Podcast: IBA Hour 13:13 - Startups, Stress and Self-Care

In this episode, Dr. Lalarukh Ejaz, Director, IBA-CED, and Dr. Ayesha Mian, Founder and CEO, Synapse, explored the intersections between mental health and entrepreneurship in Pakistan.

They challenged hustle culture, highlighted systemic neglect of founders' mental well-being, and made a case for prioritizing mental health from the start of every entrepreneurial journey.

Together, they explored where entrepreneurship meets emotional resilience and why mental health needs to be part of the conversation from day one.

IBA-CICT organized a one-day cybersecurity conference, Beyond The Firewall 3.0, which brought together experts, professionals, and students to discuss emerging cyber threats. The event opened with remarks by Mahwish Ahmed, Manager Programs-CICT, and a welcome address by Dr. Shakeel Khoja, Dean IBA-SMCS, followed by a keynote from Dr. Haider Abbas, Director General, Pakistan's National Cyber Emergency Response Team, Government of Pakistan.

Highlights included two thought-provoking panels: 'The Wire Warfare' moderated by Jawwad Farid, with panelists Dr. Haider Abbas, Faisal Anwar, Mubariz Siddiqui, and Habib Ullah; and 'Surviving Invisible Conflict', moderated by Haris Shamsi, with Shoukat Bizinjo, Khurram Javed, Dr. Mehreen Afzal, and Hussein Hassanali. Expert talks covered digital forensics by Dr. Faisal Iradat and the national importance of cybersecurity by Haris Shamsi.


The conference concluded with a strong message of collaboration and resilience, reinforcing IBA's commitment to building informed and secure digital communities through this initiative.

Designing Reward Strategies: IBA-CEE Empowers HR Teams Across Industries




