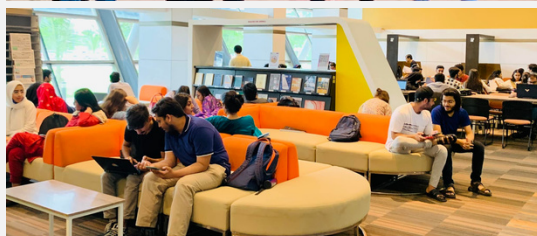

803 previously enrolled SESS students returned to campus with great vigor. All the students were radiating remarkable excitement and enthusiasm.

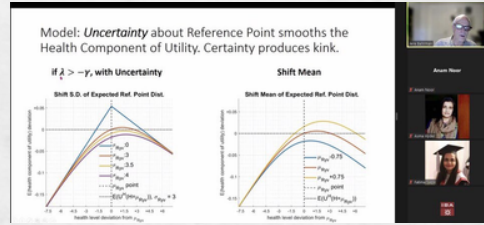
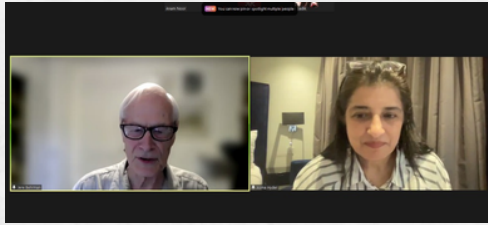
SESS Session at IBA OGala'22

Distinguished Seminar Series | University of Pennsylvania

Session I – “Early-Life Undernourishment in Developing Countries: Prevalence, Impacts over the Life Cycle and Determinants” by Prof. Jere R. Behrman

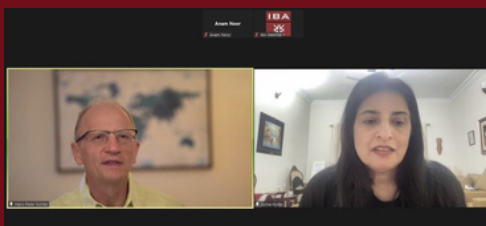


School of Economics and Social Sciences hosted a distinguished seminar series in collaboration with the University of Pennsylvania on July 13, 2022. The first session in the series by Dr. Jere Behrman, titled “Early-Life Undernourishment in Developing Countries: Prevalence, Impacts over Life Cycle and Determinants. Dr.

Behrman is a Professor of Economics/Sociology at the University of Pennsylvania. Dr. Behrman is honored with the William R. Kenan Jr. professorship in Economics. According to IDEAS/RePEc, he belongs to the 1% of highest ranked economists worldwide. The session focused on Early life undernourishment

and outcome over the life cycle based on Guatemalan INCAP Data. The online session was moderated by Dr. Asma Hyder. The seminar was conducted online and broadcasted on Facebook live.

The second session in the Distinguished Seminar Series with the University of Pennsylvania was organized on September 9, 2022. The second speaker in the series was Hans-Peter Kohler. Hans-Peter Kohler is the FJ Warren Professor of Demography and Co-Director of the Population Aging and Research Center (PARC) at the

University of Pennsylvania. Professor Kohler talked about “Demography, Aging and Global Health: Lessons from the Malawi Longitudinal Study of Families and Health”. The presentation revolved around aging among the global poor, mortality perceptions and sexual behaviors, effects of BenKnow intervention The session was

moderated by Dr. Asma Hyder. The seminar was conducted online and broadcasted on Facebook live.

A discussion on Current State of Pakistan's Economy by Dr. Miftah Ismail, Federal Minister for Finance and Revenue

The SESS organized a discussion on the Current state of Pakistan's Economy by Dr. Miftah Ismail, Federal Minister of Finance and Revenue, and Dr. Akbar Zaidi, Executive Director, IBA, on September 2nd, 2022. The session was moderated by Dr. Akbar Zaidi, IBA. Miftah Ismail presented the facts and figures regarding the current state of Pakistan's economy and also discussed the way forward. "We have to live within our means," said Dr. Ismail. He also emphasised on increasing the FX reserves by improving current account balance, increasing agricultural productivity and enhancing exports specifically through the diversification of



exports. Dr. Ismail's way forward also focused on improving economic governance and quality of education in Pakistan. Moreover, he discussed the flood situation in Pakistan along with the destructions and consequences it can have on the economy. According to Dr. Miftah, Pakistan is at a higher risk of food insecurity due to the floods; if the area used for wheat cultivation is not dried up fast, Pakistan may face severe wheat shortage in the spring. The discussion was followed by an interestingly interactive question and answer session by the IBA faculty and students.



Anis Ke Rang: The Many Shades of Mir Anis (1802-1874)



The Many Shades of Mir Anis (1802-1874) – An effort by the Department of Social Sciences and Liberal Arts at the School of Economics and Social Sciences featuring the famous Urdu scholar and political activist, Dr. Aliyah Imam, to highlight the cultural strength of Karachi in the elegiac poetry genre, making today's Karachi perhaps the biggest stronghold of this form of Urdu literary production in the subcontinent in contemporary times.



Students, faculty, and enthusiasts of this literary genre were left awestruck by the artistry and eloquence with which Dr. Imam recited Mir Anis and expounded on his poetic excellence.

The discussion, titled 'Anis Ke Rang' also featured a brief, but enlightening lecture on the global literary standing of Mir Anis by famous Urdu poet Mr. Firasat Rizvi, and a demonstration of the art of sozkhani by Mr. Qaseem Zaidi and Brothers, who presented the poetry of Mir Anis through the medium of the ragas of Hindustani classical music.

The organizer of the event, Ms. Zahra Sabri, who teaches Indo-Islamic History and Literatures at the IBA, highlighted how the legacy of Mir Anis lives on and thrives in the city of Karachi through the efforts of the migrant families who came here from Mir Anis' home territory of Lucknow and how the legacy of the art of marsiyah writing and recitation continues to connect the cities of Lucknow and Karachi in a strong linguistic and cultural bond.

SESS x PCP Partnership

Pakistan Centre for Philanthropy joined hands with the SESS as a partner organization where mutual research or a course on Philanthropy can be introduced for developing a sense of moral responsibility amongst students who will become future leaders and managers. Workshop on Data Analysis & Applications of Demographic & Health Survey



The Population Research Center (PRC) at the School of Economics and Social Sciences (SESS), organized a 4-day workshop on Data Analysis and Applications of the Demographic and Health Survey (DHS). The workshop aimed at introducing participants to the DHS Data Set, the various dimensions of the data available in it and how relevant data can be extracted for research analyses. Workshop Facilitator was Masood Ahmed Siddiqui, PhD scholar associated with the department of Economics at IBA. He has over 5 years of experience in research and teaching in different universities. Masood is a certified data user of DHS program and has published research using DHS datasets. The workshop particularly benefited students pursuing BS and MS in Economics, Social Sciences and Development Studies, those working on final year projects or ones looking to explore different datasets available for research.

SESS Faculty Meeting

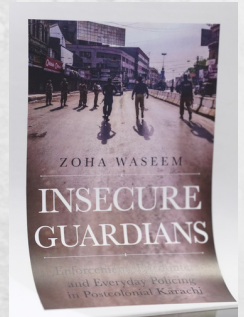

Book Launch

Insecure Guardians: Enforcement, Encounters, and Everyday Policing in Postcolonial Karachi by Zoha Waseem

Dr. Zoha Waseem discussed about her book and interacted with the students. She is an Assistant Professor at the Department of Sociology, University of Warwick, UK. She is also co-coordinator for the Urban Violence Research Network, an international platform that connects researchers working on urban violence, security, and related areas.

Webinar “Floods 2022: Situation, Response, Blind spots and Way Forward”

Recent floods in Pakistan have created a large-scale humanitarian crisis. To debate, Centre for Business and Economic Research conducted a webinar “Floods 2022: Situation, Response, Blind spots and Way Forward” on September 1st, 2022, in collaboration with Sindh Agriculture University Tandojam. It was a platform to bring the best minds together to enhance the understanding of the floods in the context of our own and global experiences, to appreciate the full spectrum of losses, to assess the state of our disaster management capacity, human and resources constraints and to come up with a set of short, medium, and long-term recommendations.



Extreme Heat and Urban Vulnerability: Intersections of Governance, Health and Urban Planning in Karachi



On September 8, 2022, the Karachi Urban Lab hosted a seminar titled “Extreme Heat and Urban Vulnerability: Intersections of Governance, Health and Urban Planning in Karachi” at IBA City Campus. In the seminar, the KUL team of researchers presented findings from their scoping study “Designed to Fail: Heat Governance in Urban South Asia: The Case of Karachi”. The findings emphasize the need to understand heat, microclimates, urban planning, infrastructural inequities, and vulnerability in

relational context. Present at the event, chief guests Dr. Asma Haider (Professor and Dean at the School of Economics and Social Sciences IBA) and Syed Jawad Muzaffar (Additional Commissioner Karachi) spoke regarding the importance of such work, especially considering Pakistan’s recent facing with climate disasters. During the seminar, Dr. Hassaan Khan (Assistant Professor, Integrated Science and Mathematics, Habib University) presented original climate data analysis for the last 60 years in Karachi, and future projections to quantify the rapid temperature change in the city: findings that underscore why it is important now, more than ever, to talk about heat in the context of an unequal city. In addition, Muhammad Toheed (Associate Director, KUL), Soha Macktoom (Associate Director, KUL & Lecturer SSLA/IBA) and Aqdas Fatima (Research Associate, KUL) presented on the current stakeholders and management involved in Karachi’s heat space, as well as potential models that can be used for better planning to manage and mitigate impacts of rising temperatures at the urban scale. This was followed by Dr. Adam Abdullah (Associate Director, KUL & Lecturer, SSLA/IBA) who shared hard-hitting findings regarding household and commercial experiences of heat, which were gathered from KUL’s most recent large-scale survey exercise of 15,000 households and 5000 commercial surveys across Karachi. Giving his remarks, chief guest Dr. Noman Ahmed (Professor and Dean, Faculty of Architecture and Management Sciences, NED University) spoke about the intersections between land issues and heat impacts, especially in the ways they seep into governance practices such as the provision and management of safe and accessible public spaces. After a rich Q&A session, Dr. Nausheen Anwar (Prof. City & Regional Planning, SSLA/IBA and Director/Founder KUL) closed the event with an important note on the complexity of studying heat as a chronic urban concern, and its implications on public health. She also addressed the urgent need to address these concerns considering the development of the Pakistan Cooling Action Plan and its critical relevance to cities, which are left out of the broader policy discourse on climate change impacts and adaptation.



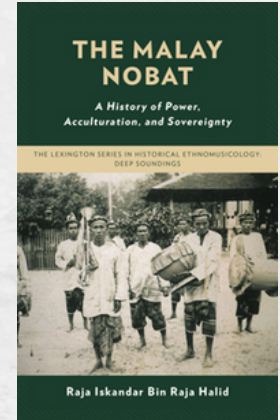
Seminar on The Malay Nobat: A History of Power, Acculturation, and Sovereignty

Dr. Raja Iskandar Bin Raja Halid, Department of Heritage, University of Malaysia, Kelantan, Malaysia, delivered a lecture on Monday, September 26, 2022, at 5:00 PM in G & T Auditorium, IBA main campus. The topic of the lecture was "The Malay Nobat: A History of Power, Acculturation, and Sovereignty". This lecture was arranged and sponsored by the School of Economics and Social Sciences (SESS) of the Institute of Business Administration (IBA), Karachi. Dr. Abdul Haque Chang, Assistant Professor of Anthropology at IBA, Karachi moderated this seminar.

This talk explored the history and meaning of the Nobat, a court ensemble that has performed music for courts in Malaysia and Brunei with roots in the Islamicate world since Abbassid times. Raja Iskandar examined how the Nobat spread throughout the Muslim empire and its emergence as a symbol of power and sovereignty. He argued that the Nobat was an important symbol of Muslim power and analyzed the effect of the Nobat's appropriation by colonial powers and of its induction as part of an invented tradition in the process of nation-building a modern Malay state. Raja Iskandar ultimately showed how existing Nobat ensembles are the last living musical legacy of the Muslim world, performed within its original context – to install rulers.

Raja Iskandar Bin Raja Halid is an Ethnomusicologist and Associate Professor in the Department of Heritage, Faculty of Creative Technology and Heritage at University Malaysia Kelantan, Malaysia. He holds a bachelor's in music degree from the National Academy of Arts, Culture and Heritage (ASWARA), bachelor's in applied arts (Music Technology) and Master of Arts (Ethnomusicology) from University Malaysia Sarawak (UNIMAS) and PhD in Music Research (Ethnomusicology) from King's College London.

Raja Iskandar is the author of "The Malay Nobat: A History of Power, Acculturation, and Sovereignty" (2022, Lexington Books, USA) and "The Royal Nobat of Perak" (2018, UMK Press). His articles have been published in journals and as book chapters in local and international publications. In 2012 he was appointed as a Visiting Fellow at King's College London and served as a member of the Committee of Experts in Malay Traditional Performing Arts appointed by the National Heritage Department of Malaysia. His research interests lie in the areas of Malay court music, identity, colonialism, Islam, and popular culture.



Human Factors Training in Germany



On June 20, 2022, Recypher organized two-week training at Saarland University in Saarbrücken. Dr. Sahar Nadeem, Chairperson of Department of SSLA, an expert in memory processes conducted a training and spoke about cyber hygiene and the utility of passwords, linking the creation of secure passwords to memory processes such as chunking. Within two weeks of training, speakers from different universities and institutions presented topics around psychology and cybersecurity in order to develop a first draft of a Human Factor course at the end of two weeks.
